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Nassau County

1 ERICA RICHARDS: Joel, you made it.  
2 Yay. Joel, can you unmute yourself? Lower left-  
3 hand corner, there's a microphone icon.

4 JOEL BERSE: Okay. That's it?

5 ERICA RICHARDS: That's it. We're on.  
6 Now we just to wait the other -- for the others  
7 to join. How are you?

8 JOEL BERSE: I just came back from the  
9 dentist so I don't know. I haven't decided yet.

10 ERICA RICHARDS: God bless you. That  
11 is -- I have a big fear with that. Oh, boy.

12 JOEL BERSE: Everything here -- it says  
13 Barbara but it's me.

14 ERICA RICHARDS: No, I know. I  
15 figured. As soon as I saw Barbara Berse joined I  
16 was like, yes, so that's great. Let's see. Oh,  
17 I think we have someone else who has joined. Oh,  
18 Mr. Duroseau.

19 JOEL BERSE: Did Jack tell you I called  
20 him this morning?

21 ERICA RICHARDS: He did mention that  
22 you guys chatted.

23 JOEL BERSE: Well, I was on the phone  
24 with the county execs office again bitching and  
25 moaning at they're dragging their feet for us,

1 and it also -- afterward, we discussed what we're  
2 doing with the vote here and my concerns. And  
3 they said as long as it's recorded, we should be  
4 okay as far as all the rules are concerned.

5 ERICA RICHARDS: Okay. Yeah, I'm  
6 double recording. I'm recording on Zoom. I'm  
7 also going to record on my iPhone and then I will  
8 transcript everything.

9 JOEL BERSE: All right. Well, that's  
10 what they said -- you know, beyond what we're  
11 doing or whatever because there is a question  
12 whether or not not in pandemic this is an  
13 emergency.

14 ERICA RICHARDS: It's -- you know, we  
15 just had our two-week -- hey, Mr. Duroseau. How  
16 are you?

17 JOEL BERSE: How you feeling? He might  
18 be muted.

19 ERICA RICHARDS: It says he's  
20 connecting to audio still. I think he's still  
21 connecting. I'm not sure if he can hear us.  
22 He's on his iPhone. Can you hear us, Mr.  
23 Duroseau?

24 JOEL BERSE: Jean.

25 ERICA RICHARDS: Oh, Jean, you need --

1 JOEL BERSE: -- dancing machine. Are  
2 you on?

3 ERICA RICHARDS: Jean, you need to  
4 unmute. There should be an microphone icon in  
5 the bottom that you can unclick. There we go.

6 JEAN DUROSEAU: I can hear you now.

7 ERICA RICHARDS: Hi. How are you?  
8 It's so good to see you.

9 JEAN DUROSEAU: It's so good to see you  
10 too.

11 JOEL BERSE: We missed you the other  
12 day, kiddo. You all right?

13 JEAN DUROSEAU: I know. I didn't feel  
14 well so I'm still out of the blue but, you know,  
15 we got to do what we have to do.

16 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah. Exactly. But  
17 we appreciate you taking the time. Hopefully,  
18 this won't be very long.

19 JEAN DUROSEAU: Let's hope so.

20 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah.

21 JOEL BERSE: The other day Jackie came  
22 for the first time in a while. It was nice to  
23 see her.

24 JEAN DUROSEAU: You heard about  
25 (indiscernible), right, (indiscernible). You

1 heard about Rosalio (indiscernible).

2 JOEL BERSE: No. What happened?

3 ERICA RICHARDS: We just heard there  
4 was a family emergency.

5 JEAN DUROSEAU: His mother passed away.

6 ERICA RICHARDS: Oh.

7 JOEL BERSE: Oh.

8 JEAN DUROSEAU: Yeah. Last Wednesday  
9 was the funeral and after that, I was trying to  
10 get in touch with him. See if he can be here  
11 today.

12 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah.

13 JEAN DUROSEAU: So I don't know if he  
14 got it or not.

15 ERICA RICHARDS: I don't know. I think  
16 maybe Jillian might have spoken to him but I'm so  
17 sorry about that. That's really tough.

18 JEAN DUROSEAU: Yeah. That was a tough  
19 one so --

20 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah.

21 JEAN DUROSEAU: (indiscernible)

22 JOEL BERSE: Well, as long as we have  
23 at least four of us today, we're okay.

24 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah.

25 JEAN DUROSEAU: How many are we right

1 now?

2 JOEL BERSE: The two of us. You and I.

3 JEAN DUROSEAU: The early bird, yeah?

4 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah.

5 JOEL BERSE: The A team, the best guys.

6 JEAN DUROSEAU: That's right.

7 ERICA RICHARDS: I'm just Vanna White.

8 JEAN DUROSEAU: It's all right.

9 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah. So we have  
10 about 15 minutes more.

11 JEAN DUROSEAU: Fifteen more minutes to  
12 go.

13 ERICA RICHARDS: Fifteen more minutes  
14 to go before we start.

15 JEAN DUROSEAU: All right. Anyway, I'm  
16 here. I'm just going to move out of the chair  
17 but I'll be here in a minute. I'll be back in a  
18 minute.

19 ERICA RICHARDS: That's fine.

20 JOEL BERSE: How do I raise the volume?

21 ERICA RICHARDS: On your --

22 JEAN DUROSEAU: I'm good.

23 ERICA RICHARDS: -- your lower right-  
24 hand side, there should be -- you can see a  
25 volume.

1 JOEL BERSE: No.

2 ERICA RICHARDS: You don't see that?

3 JEAN DUROSEAU: I'm cool, man. I can  
4 hear you guys very well.

5 JOEL BERSE: When I tested the  
6 speakers, they were much better than what I'm  
7 hearing with you guys talking now. Let me see.

8 ERICA RICHARDS: I'm not sure, Joel.  
9 I'm not sure how your computer is configured.

10 JOEL BERSE: Oh, that's -- I'm at a  
11 loss without Barbara here.

12 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah.

13 JOEL BERSE: She set me up and had to  
14 go where she had to go. New option.

15 (indiscernible) window, annotate, exit

16 (indiscernible), side by side --

17 JEAN DUROSEAU: I'm using my phone  
18 because I just find out. My computer need  
19 (indiscernible) required.

20 ERICA RICHARDS: Oh.

21 JEAN DUROSEAU: So I'm using my phone.

22 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah. The phone  
23 (indiscernible) easy.

24 JEAN DUROSEAU: For that meeting, you  
25 need 5.11.4 or higher --

1 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah.

2 JEAN DUROSEAU: -- version so I'm cool  
3 with that. I have my phone so --

4 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah. I had to update  
5 real quick last month. I discovered that I  
6 needed to update too.

7 JOEL BERSE: Well, this asked me for an  
8 update today as I was -- you know, as we were  
9 signing on so I don't know what it did to my  
10 computer but we're here.

11 JEAN DUROSEAU: Yeah, we're here.  
12 We're here and we're going to have a vote. All  
13 right?

14 ERICA RICHARDS: Yes. Yes, sir.

15 JEAN DUROSEAU: I'll be back.

16 ERICA RICHARDS: Okay. Joel, have you  
17 gone on vacation anywhere this year?

18 JOEL BERSE: No. We're going at the  
19 end of the summer.

20 ERICA RICHARDS: Oh, nice. Where are  
21 you going to go?

22 JOEL BERSE: California. It's a  
23 combination for her birthday and our 25th because  
24 it may be the last time I can make airplane  
25 travel. And we were supposed to do this pre-



1 pandemic and it got cancelled.

2 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah.

3 JOEL BERSE: So we're doing LA and San  
4 Diego in combination. We're doing our final  
5 California ballpark in San Diego. We're going  
6 back to Dodger stadium. We were there in 2012  
7 with the White Sox and we're going to go to that  
8 new motion picture museum and the 100th  
9 anniversary of Warner Brothers studios as long as  
10 this stupid strike doesn't affect it.

11 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah. Well, that --  
12 I'm sure it'll be resolved by the time you get  
13 there. That sounds like a great trip.

14 JOEL BERSE: So -- well, I hope so.  
15 Also they made a new LAPD police museum from the  
16 last time I went to that so I want to revisit  
17 Jack Webb's old exhibits --

18 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah.

19 JOEL BERSE: -- and see what else they  
20 added. And they added a fire museum for LA  
21 County that has the two trucks in the TV show  
22 Emergency in it.

23 ERICA RICHARDS: Oh, you're kidding.

24 JOEL BERSE: And Barbara used to like  
25 Randolph Mantooth.

1 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah. Yeah, I'm young  
2 enough to remember that show -- or old enough, I  
3 should say, to remember it. Emergency and 1  
4 Adam-12.

5 JOEL BERSE: Well, Adam-12 was -- it  
6 was a spinoff of Adam-12.

7 ERICA RICHARDS: Yep.

8 JOEL BERSE: (indiscernible) you guys  
9 are costing me my Adam-12 time in the other room.  
10 Maybe I should go in there and come back.

11 ERICA RICHARDS: You could do that. I  
12 mean, we'll be starting in about 12 minutes or  
13 so. You just need to --

14 JOEL BERSE: All right. So when the  
15 first episode ends, I'll come back.

16 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah, yeah. You can  
17 just leave the computer on.

18 JOEL BERSE: Yep.

19 ERICA RICHARDS: All right. See you in  
20 a bit.

21 JOEL BERSE: Okay.

22 (Off topic conversation)

23 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Hi.

24 ERICA RICHARDS: Hi. How are you?

25 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Good. How are you?

1                   ERICA RICHARDS: Good. I've got --  
2 Joel is watching TV in the other room.

3                   JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Okay.

4                   ERICA RICHARDS: And we've got Mr.  
5 Duroseau. He's here. He's just in another room  
6 too.

7                   JILLIAN ENRIGHT: All right. Sounds  
8 good.

9                   ERICA RICHARDS: We've got two.

10                  JILLIAN ENRIGHT: So we're just waiting  
11 for some others.

12                  ERICA RICHARDS: Yes. I am -- I've had  
13 some issues with the Zoom account as far as  
14 recording, and I had our tech guy work on it for  
15 a couple hours yesterday. I think it's okay but  
16 I'm going to record on my phone also.

17                  JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Okay. It says it's  
18 recording on the top left.

19                  ERICA RICHARDS: Great.

20                  JILLIAN ENRIGHT: So it should be good.

21                  ERICA RICHARDS: I hope so. And then -  
22 -

23                  JILLIAN ENRIGHT: And then when I  
24 entered, it said recording in progress too so.

25                  ERICA RICHARDS: Right. Let's hope

1 that's the case.

2 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Yeah.

3 ERICA RICHARDS: And then we'll work on  
4 getting it transcribed.

5 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Yeah.

6 JEAN DUROSEAU: I'm back.

7 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Hi, Mr. Duroseau. We  
8 have our legal counsel, Jillian Enright, here.

9 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Hi.

10 JEAN DUROSEAU: Hey. How are you guys  
11 doing?

12 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Good. How are you  
13 feeling?

14 JEAN DUROSEAU: All right. You know,  
15 getting better.

16 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Good.

17 ERICA RICHARDS: Jillian, were you able  
18 to talk to Tony?

19 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: No. I had called  
20 him. I couldn't get ahold of him.

21 ERICA RICHARDS: Okay. Mr. Duroseau,  
22 he -- I guess he spoke to him last week. I guess  
23 his mother passed last week.

24 JEAN DUROSEAU: Yeah, his mother passed  
25 away.

1 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Yeah.

2 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah. That was the  
3 issue there.

4 JEAN DUROSEAU: Yeah. He was trying to  
5 talk to you guys but he (indiscernible) so --

6 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah. No. That's  
7 totally understandable.

8 JEAN DUROSEAU: He called me and I just  
9 passed the message. I was trying to get back to  
10 him to see if he can here today, but I call, I  
11 call. I couldn't reach him so --

12 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: I tried too. I left  
13 him a message but he might just be, you know,  
14 caught up in other stuff.

15 JEAN DUROSEAU: Yeah. I know. One  
16 more minute.

17 ERICA RICHARDS: Yes. We are getting  
18 close, aren't we? Let me see if there -- oh,  
19 we've got -- Mr. Khzouz is about to join us. Oh,  
20 whoops. I'm going to do this. All right. Okay.  
21 We have somebody joining by phone. Hold on one  
22 second here. And we have Sharon Persaud is  
23 joining. And let's see. And Jackie D'Agostino  
24 is joining. Ms. D'Agostino, can you unmute  
25 yourself when you have a chance? And our guest

1 caller dialing from 010000, if you could unmute  
2 yourself also. Dawn Barletta is joining. Joel  
3 is back with us. So very quickly, we have Sharon  
4 Persaud. We have Mr. Duroseau, Mr. Jack Khzouz,  
5 Ms. Jillian Enright, Ms. Jackie D'Agostino, Ms.  
6 Dawn Bartlett, Mr. Joel Berse, and myself. And  
7 we have -- and whoever called in has --

8 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Yeah. I don't know.  
9 That dropped out it looked like.

10 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah. It did drop  
11 out and I don't know who that was but we have  
12 four current members -- Mr. Duroseau, Mr. Berse,  
13 Ms. D'Agostino, and Ms. Bartlett -- Bartletta,  
14 excuse me. Someone's coming back in.

15 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: They're still muted.

16 ERICA RICHARDS: Yeah. Could the  
17 person who's calling in on line 0100 please  
18 unmute themselves?

19 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Or Erica, as the  
20 host, can you unmute everyone? I don't know if  
21 you can do that.

22 ERICA RICHARDS: I can't.

23 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: That might be teams.

24 ERICA RICHARDS: Oh, they're unmuted.  
25 Whose ever call in, can you please identify

1 yourself?

2 SHARON PERSAUD: Sharon Persaud.

3 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Oh, it's your  
4 (indiscernible). Oh, okay.

5 ERICA RICHARDS: Okay.

6 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: All right. So I  
7 guess we (indiscernible) right?

8 ERICA RICHARDS: (indiscernible)  
9 Sharon. Okay. Good.

10 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: All right. We're  
11 good to go then, right?

12 ERICA RICHARDS: Right.

13 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: All right. Good  
14 evening, everyone. Thanks for meeting on a  
15 little bit of short notice so we could get this  
16 vote done. Just since we are on Zoom and since  
17 it's being recorded, we're just going to start by  
18 having everyone identify themselves so their  
19 names match up with their voices. So I'll start  
20 with myself. Jillian Enright.

21 JACKIE D'AGOSTINO: Jackie D'Agostino.

22 JEAN DUROSEAU: Jean Duroseau.

23 JOEL BERSE: Joel Berse.

24 DAWN FALCO: Dawn Falco.

25 JACK KHZOUZ: Jack Khzouz.

1 ERICA RICHARDS: Erica Richards.

2 (indiscernible)

3 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: All right. Good. So  
4 we're just going to start. I think Jack is going  
5 to do a short presentation, just briefly, about  
6 the proposal fare changes and he's just going to  
7 go over any additional public comments that were  
8 (indiscernible).

9 JACK KHZOUZ: Excellent. Thank you,  
10 Ms. Enright. I appreciate it and I appreciate  
11 everybody getting back together in short notice.  
12 Like I said, we're going just to go over the fare  
13 proposal again very briefly and then make sure  
14 that everybody understands the fare increases and  
15 then, again, ensure that everybody has read the  
16 public comments that came in and acknowledges  
17 that we have accepted the Title 6 study.

18 So as I discussed the other night, our  
19 fare increase will -- assuming we vote in the  
20 positive -- would go into effect August 20th.  
21 This really is to match the MTA fare increase  
22 that's going into effect August 20th.

23 So the current base fare for an adult  
24 ride is 2.75. the proposed fare increase is to  
25 2.90, up 15 cents. Senior fare, disabled fare,



1 both increased by a dime, from \$1.35 to \$1.45.  
2 The student fare goes up to \$2.25. Child fare --  
3 I'm sorry -- student fare remains the same at  
4 \$2.25. The child fare and the transfer from the  
5 MTA to Nice, assuming we keep the fare increase  
6 in place, continues to be free for the transfer.  
7 Child fare continues to be free. The transfer  
8 from south -- from Suffolk County, Hart or Long  
9 Beach stays the same at 25 cents. The single  
10 ride E ticket goes from \$3 to 3.25.

11 There are small increases in the seven-  
12 day unlimited ride. A dollar goes up to \$34.  
13 The 30-day unlimited ride goes from 127 to \$132  
14 and the 20-pack E ticket goes from 55 to \$58.  
15 Additionally, we're proposing a 25 percent  
16 increase -- 25-cent increase, I'm sorry -- in our  
17 paratransit-based fare from 3.75 to \$4.

18 Again, the last -- just to reiterate --  
19 the last fixed route base fare increase was  
20 implemented in 2015 so that was quite a while ago  
21 and able-ride fare increase hasn't been  
22 implemented since 2010 so these increases are  
23 relatively modest. They would allow our riders  
24 to not have to pay the step-up charge or a whole  
25 other fare by going into the MTA. If we don't

1 apply these fare increases, there wouldn't be  
2 alignment between us and the MTA so those riders  
3 would be affected negatively and the county would  
4 lose out on the additional revenue.

5 So that's all I have on the fare  
6 increase. We did, again, do a Title 6 study  
7 which is mandated by the FTA. What the study is  
8 intended to show is that by increasing fares, we  
9 may have disproportionately affected certain  
10 minorities, certain populations, or certain  
11 economic groups within the county --  
12 disproportionately to at the benefit of others.  
13 The study does not show that disparate impact or  
14 disproportionate burden so that we have applied  
15 the increase accordingly across the whole  
16 population equally.

17 So the public comments, as they were  
18 before, I'm not going to necessarily read these.  
19 I would assume -- Mr. Duroseau was the only one  
20 that wasn't at the meeting last week -- I would  
21 assume he read already but if you'd like, Ms.  
22 Enright, I can reread them or we can -- whatever  
23 you'd like us to do here.

24 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: I think it's okay.  
25 We sent copies to everyone before this meeting

1 today. So everyone has copies of it.

2 JACK KHZOUZ: Understood. Thank you  
3 very much. So that concludes my presentation for  
4 the meeting. Again, it's good to get everybody  
5 back together again so that we can talk about  
6 this. And as Ms. Enright said as we started,  
7 this will be recorded. It will be placed in  
8 public record so Ms. Enright, I'll take it back  
9 to you if you want to -- if there are any  
10 questions, I'd be happy to answer them from  
11 anyone on the board.

12 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Yeah. I don't have  
13 any questions. Does anyone else on the board  
14 have any?

15 JOEL BERSE: Jack, I did think of one.  
16 Am I on there? Jack --

17 JACK KHZOUZ: Yep.

18 JOEL BERSE: -- I did think of one.  
19 Comparatively speaking to the Suffolk and to the  
20 city, what is their rate for the paratransit?

21 JACK KHZOUZ: We are -- we will be  
22 exactly the same as the fixed -- as the city and  
23 we are actually I believe a little lower than  
24 Suffolk and we are a dollar lower than  
25 Westchester.

1 JOEL BERSE: Okay. Thanks.

2 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Anyone else? No.

3 Okay. All right. I guess with that, then, we  
4 can move on acceptance of Title 6 so would any  
5 member like to move -- to make a motion to accept  
6 Title 6?

7 JEAN DUROSEAU: I make a motion.

8 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Anyone second it?

9 JOEL BERSE: Second.

10 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: All those is favor  
11 say aye.

12 ALL: Aye.

13 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Any opposed? All  
14 right. Vote carries in acceptance of Title 6.  
15 All right. Any other comments, concerns,  
16 (indiscernible) by anyone?

17 JOEL BERSE: Well, so the other thing  
18 is with Tony not here, we did wind up with four  
19 for the quorum and the issues that I was raising  
20 are going to stay active with the county  
21 executive's office that I spoke about this  
22 morning to get us two more members assigned to  
23 this committee. And I was told that they would  
24 earnestly work on it in the next week.

25 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Great.

1 DAWN FALCO: Thank you.

2 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: All right. So with  
3 that, anyone make a motion to adjourn the  
4 meeting?

5 JACK KHZOUZ: Oh, Ms. Enright, may I  
6 interrupt? I'm sorry.

7 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Yep.

8 JACK KHZOUZ: We do need to vote  
9 actually on the fare increase itself.

10 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: oh, okay.

11 JACK KHZOUZ: I apologize. I should  
12 have made that clear. That was my fault.

13 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: No problem. All  
14 right. So we'll move to -- anyone like to make a  
15 motion to accept the fare increase?

16 DAWN FALCO: I'll make the motion.

17 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Second?

18 JEAN DUROSEAU: I second it. I second  
19 it.

20 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: All those in favor  
21 say aye.

22 ALL: Aye.

23 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Any opposed? All  
24 right. Vote carries in acceptance of the fare  
25 increase.

1 JACK KHZOUZ: Thank you, Ms. Enright.

2 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: All right. So make a  
3 motion to adjourn the meeting?

4 SHARON PERSAUD: So moved.

5 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: Second?

6 DAWN FALCO: Second.

7 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: All right. All in  
8 favor.

9 ALL: Aye.

10 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: All right. Thank  
11 you, everyone.

12 DAWN FALCO: Thank you so much. Have a  
13 good night.

14 JEAN DUROSEAU: Yeah.

15 JACK KHZOUZ: Bye-bye now. Thank you.

16 SHARON PERSAUD: Goodbye.

17 JOEL BERSE: When are we going to be  
18 meeting again approximately?

19 JACK KHZOUZ: It will be in the --  
20 probably in the late falls sometime, Joel. I  
21 haven't quite looked at the calendar yet but  
22 that's traditionally when we meet again.

23 JOEL BERSE: So you're talking October,  
24 November?

25 JACK KHZOUZ: Probably late September,

1 early October.

2 JOEL BERSE: All right. September is -  
3 - got to be very careful because of a lot things  
4 on the schedule and my same thing with November  
5 so --

6 JACK KHZOUZ: Yep. Understood.

7 JOEL BERSE: Or October.

8 JACK KHZOUZ: All right.

9 JILLIAN ENRIGHT: We give a lot of  
10 notice so.

11 JOEL BERSE: Okay.

12 JACK KHZOUZ: Thank you much.

13 JOEL BERSE: Have a good day,  
14 everybody.
